CLOSING COMMENTS

This applied equally to the delivery of coaching, sports science and sports medicine services, the conduct of national programs or the operation of a national system. It has become very obvious to me that, irrespective of where we live on this planet, cooperation, coordination and communication are essential ingredients in sport. They are the essence of what cohesive teams and partnerships are all about. Good relationships are the glue that binds the community together. In short, we have to learn to get on with each other and work together. As an international community I hope that this applies equally to us and that we can continue to meet regularly in the future. We have a lot to learn from each other.

In conclusion, may I thank you all for attending the Forum and contributing so willingly to the program. I hope that you have a safe trip home and that we see you back in Sydney at the Olympic Games next year.
