Own The Podium History

 When the 2010 Olympic Winter Games were awarded by the IOC to Vancouver in the summer of 2003, the winter sport organizations and the sport funding partners (VANOC, Sport Canada, CPC and COC) developed a national plan which included the goal of 'owning the podium'.







Own The Podium

A Unique Organization

- \$110 Million over 5 years to augment funding for 'excellence'.
- All Partners have agreed on specific performance goals.
- OTP 2010 new programming including; Research & Innovation, Recruitment, and Performance Enhancement Teams (PET) to assist each sport.



Own the Podium

A Unique Leadership Model

- All Funding, Sport and Performance Partners will coordinate their roles, policies, funding and programs via OTP 2010 to create a more focused and effective approach.
- OTP 2010 is a **partnership**, including a sharing of human resources from various organizations, so as not to duplicate or create unnecessary administration.


GOALS: Finish First at Olympics Top 3 at Paralympics

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Own the Podium

Targeted Approach

- OTP targets athletes and their support systems to win medals
- OTP funding is an 'enhancement' to a sports other 'core' financial support
- Some sports may receive little or no funding from OTP, depending on the number of medalist potential athletes
- However, all sports will be able to field full teams in 2010 as per IF regulations.



OTP Technical Readiness

- Establish Advisors to assist NSOs
- Establish 2007-2010 detailed technical plans
- Improve implementation of technical plans
- Strengthen technical leadership coaches, HPDs
- Improve & consolidate PET service & policies
- Enhanced video & technical support
- Improved data analysis



OTP Organizational Readiness

- Strengthen NSO leadership & program delivery
- Assist NSO planning & implementation
- Evaluate NSO needs, and resolve issues
- Develop financial sustainability plan post-2010

- The Canadian Paralympic Committee (CPC)
 opened a second office in Vancouver in April 2005
- 5 Sports on the 2010 Program
 - Alpine Skiing
 - Cross Country Skiing
 - Biathlon
 - Sledge Hockey
 - Wheelchair Curling



- Areas of Priority in CPC's 2010 Planning:
 - Talent Identification and recruitment
 - Coaching full-time paid coaches
 - PET/Sport Science/Medicine
 - Enhanced Training and Competition
 - Equipment Research and Development



- 2010 Canadian Team Size Projections:
 - 50+ athletes in all 5 sports
- Excellent working relationship with VANOC has been established



- CPC conducts on-going site visits with VANOC
- 2010 Chef de Mission selection process has recently been completed (normally done 2 years out)



- An "Excellence Series" has been established that will focus on increasing athlete and coach games preparation, peer mentoring, and cross training
- Creation of OTP has enhanced the link between our NSOs servicing able-bodied athletes and athletes with a disability



Olympic Preparation

- Targeted sports, medal possibilities, events, coaches
- Money managed on a targeted basis
 - \$22M (CDN) x 5 years
- R and D
- Increase resources for PET (science/medicine), coaches, competitions




Olympic Preparation

- Planning more focused, more rigorous, thorough, thoughtful planning process
- Integrated, multi-disciplinary, more scrutinized and monitored; more innovation
- Longer term thinking (vs. annual budget cycle)
- Planning to create success and after action review

2010 Facility Update

- VANOC venue construction program remains "on time and on budget" at \$580 million
- Construction is now underway at all major Vancouver 2010 competition and noncompetition venues - VANOC is on track to completing most of its competition venues one to two full winter competition seasons before the Games to maximize venue testing and athlete training opportunities;
- More than half of the venue construction budget has now been expended;



• Whistler Nordic Centre: 14km Trails & Daylodge (Biathlon, XC, Nordic Combined, Ski Jumping)






• Whistler Sliding Centre: 1,700 Meter track (Bobsleigh, Luge & Skeleton)
