




- Following the Olympic Games in Stockholm in 1912, the Swiss Olympic Committee was founded.
- Founding of Swiss Olympic: 1997
 (Merger: NOC & Umbrella federation)
- Approx. 70 employees (15 in sports department,
 3 in the Olympic missions department)



- We don't lead...only exeption: missions
- The athletes are not «owned» by Swiss Olympic...only exeption: on missions
- Slim administration



Money: The Swiss Tube Map










Budget 2018 – Income





- Consulting & controlling critical friend approach
- Classification of NF sport disciplines
- Funding allocation
- Selection processes:
 - Youth & Junior athletes (Swiss Olympic Talent Cards)
 - Olympic Missions (Youth and Elite)
- Coordination of all sorts quest for efficiency and effectivness in the sport system

How do we rank/classify the sports?



- Ranking counts for one Olympic Cycle
- Classification 1-5, Olympic & Non-Olympic
- Criteria:
 - Past results
 - Future potential
 - Quality of work
 - Importance of the sport


Ranked sports



- Classification 1: 26-37 points
- Classification 2: 20-25 points
- etc.
- Total of 19 classification 1 sports:
 - Tennis, Mountainbike, Beachvolleyball, Soccer men, cross country skiing, alpine skiing, icehockey men, etc.
- Total of 13 classification 2 sports
- Total of 19 classification 3 sports
- Approx. 130 classified sports (50% olympic)

What do we Support?



- Basis
- Performance Sport structural
- Youth/Junior & Elite coaches & measures
- Professional coaches Elite & Youth
- 10 Performance centres
- Olympic general & specific (if high potential)
- Services: Swiss Olympic Card, Career Programme, Medical Centers, Training Bases, Consultant, etc.
- Athletes gold, silver, bronze, Talent

- NF's get between 15000 CHF 6.5 Mio from SO
- Big difference 2016-2018
- Funding granted over a period or always at stake?
- Are some medals more golden than others?
- Diversification vs. specialisation?
- Strengthening vs. leading the NF's?
